### Take a picture and signature ID to the Polls or Early Voting Location Acceptable forms of ID include:

Florida law requires that a voter present current and valid picture and signature identification when voting in person. Any voter appearing to vote without identification will be allowed to vote a Provisional Ballot.



It is very important for you to keep your signature current with the Supervisor of Elections. Signatures on your registration record are used to verify signatures on petitions, and on provisional and vote-by-mail ballots. If your signatures do not match, your petition or ballot will not count. To update your signature, provide the Supervisor of Elections with a voter registration application indicating a signature update.

## FLORIDA IS A CLOSED PRIMARY STATE. WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

nly voters who are registered members of a political party ay vote for that party's candidates in a primary election, **NLESS** the race is a Universal Primary Contest.

Universal Primary Contest occurs when all candidates in e same race have the same political party affiliation and the nner will have no opposition in the General Election. In the 18 Primary, both County Commission races are Universal imary Contest. Even though County Commission races are rtisan, because all six county commission candidates have e same party affiliation, these races will be on the publican, Democratic and Nonpartisan ballots and **ALL** gible voters can vote for county commissioner in the 2018 imary. The county commission races will not advance to e 2018 General Election as they will be decided in the 2018 imary Election. **ALL** eligible voters can vote in a niversal Primary Contest and School Board Contest gardless of their political party affiliation.

e voter registration books for the 2018 Primary Election ose on July 30, 2018. This means that any new voter gistration applications or political party changes must be ceived or postmarked by July 30, 2018.

### n Election Day the Polls are open 7:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. Before you go to the polls:

- If your address or name has changed, contact the elections office BEFORE Election Day.
- Check your voter information card for the location of your polling place.
- Take your drivers license or another form of photo and signature ID to the polls.
